Class 2 Horner News

This week, the children have been singing Grandma Rap in music and they learnt a clapping game to Hi lo chicka lo that shows the rhythm. They chanted Grandma rap rhythmically and they will perform an accompaniment to the song at the end of the unit.

In maths, the year 1 children have been counting and representing numbers to 20. The year 2 children have been learning about arrays, and grouping and sharing when dividing. We have now moved onto practising our 2 times table and will be practising our 5 and 10 times table next week.

Class 4 Bucehayes News


