Bags, will be distributed in book bags. You can use normal bin bags too. There is no limit!

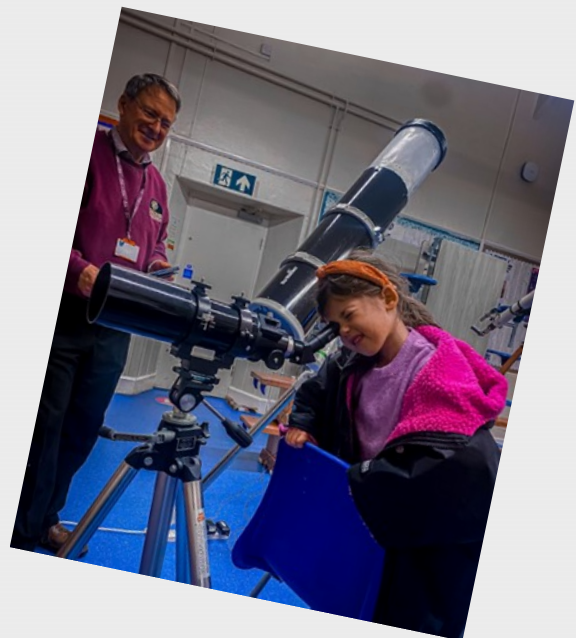
Proceeds will go to the School and Preschool.

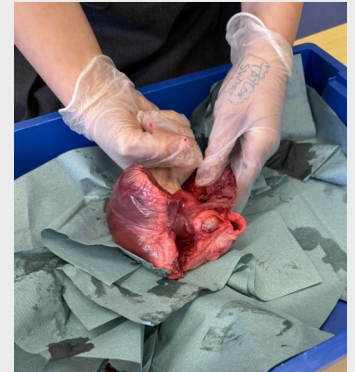

We started the week with the much anticipated Heart Dissection; I was very impressed with how mature and sensible the children were in deciding for themselves at which level they were willing to participate. We started with watching the video of a dissection that we had watched at the start of the unit, then they had the option of watching me dissect a pig's heart, the option was then given to those that wanted to have a go at dissection themselves. More children than I thought were willing to step out of their comfort zone and have a go. They spoke very confidently in identifying the parts of the heart and the route of blood flow.



We have also been very lucky this week to have Mrs Burnett (Maisie's mum) in to give a presentation and talk about her work and trips to Brazil. The talk was fantastic with photographs of so many amazing aspects of Brazil. The children had the opportunity to discuss their questions with Mrs Burnett relating to our current learning enquiry question, "Should consumers have to pay more for Fairtrade products?"

On Friday the children have been set the challenge of creating a Chinese new Year dragon from 3D shapes that they will need to create from nets of the shapes and cut from paper. We are looking out for fantastic teamwork, leadership and full engagement from all of them.

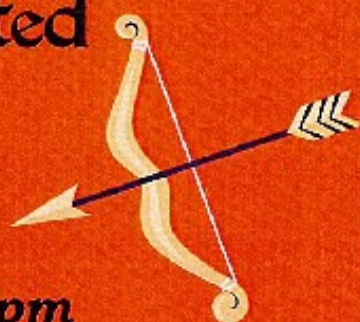

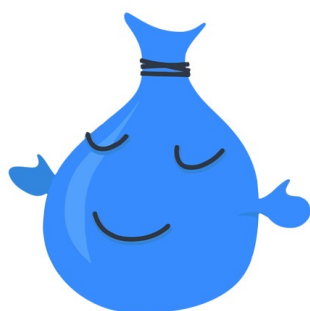
