We have been thinking about what Spring is, and what we might find in the Spring - "the leaves start to come back", "I can see daffodils", "There are lambs" Next week we will be looking at the signs of spring around our school site and also identifying the different plants we have at school and on our field.

In PE, the children have moved on from gymnastics and we enjoyed the sunny weather on Tuesday outside! The lesson was car themed, there was some amazing listening as Mr Murnane called out the different instructions and there were some very fast racing cars too, a brilliant lesson, all showing how much they have progressed since September, especially their excellent listening and concentration.

In computing, the children have been practising using scratch programming software. They learnt about the various parts of a computer, and they were able to log in and find the scratch software. They then experimented with creating their own backgrounds and characters.

In art, we have started our printmaking unit and we have practised creating textured paper using sponges and marbled paper using shaving foam. In RE, we have been continuing with Judaism and learnt more about the synagogue.



The Rhythm of the Rain by Grahame Baker-Smith is a beautiful picture book that weaves the water cycle into a story. We will be drawing ideas from text for our own writing over the next couple of weeks. Within our reading lessons, we have studied 'The Water's Journey' by Eleonore Schmid, another stunning picture book full of exciting and topical vocabulary for us to 'magpie'. Our new class reading book, unveiled on Tuesday, is The Secret Lake by Karen Inglis. This time-travelling story is about two children who discover a long lost tunnel to a secret lake...

Our other exciting news is that we are now hosts to a tank full of sea trout eggs! Over the next few weeks we will be observing the development of the eggs to fry (baby fish) before helping to release them into one of our local rivers. Watch this space for updates!
