## Family Service

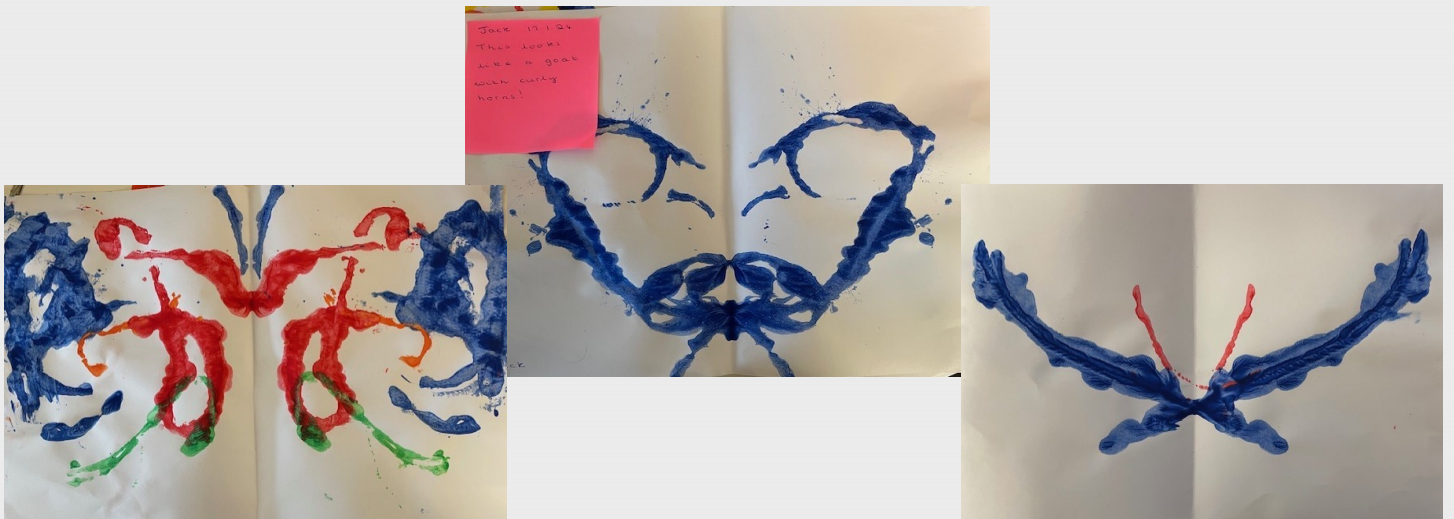
Our first Family Service of the new calendar year is this coming Sunday. You are warmly welcome to the short, all ages service at Stockland church from 11-11.30am.

## Class 1 Featherlake News

Featherlake have been learning how to partition 5 in Maths and have all demonstrated great understanding and are beginning to learn number bonds to 5 both with objects and by verbal recall. In SCARF, they talked about what is safe to go onto our bodies, for example, sun cream, clothes and plasters. In Art, there were some wonderful creations using string and paint, creating unique patterns.

Next week we are going to be starting to look at different materials and their properties. We will be using the story The Three Little Pigs to kick start our investigations.

## Class 2 Horner News

This week, the children have been learning about the different parts of plants in science. We dissected our own plants and labelled the parts and some children even described what each part does. Afterwards we used magnifying glasses to create observational drawings of each part of a plant.

In maths, the year 1 children are moving onto counting and representing numbers to 20. The year 2 children will be starting their unit on multiplication and division and learning about arrays, grouping and sharing.

We have started using the bee bots in computing and the children have been making their own routes across different mats. We are very excited to create our own mats at the end of the unit for our bee-bots to use.

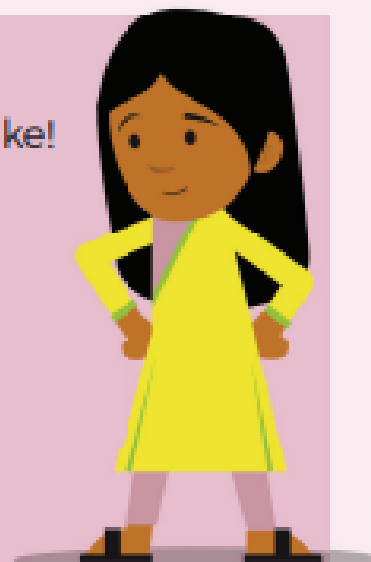
## THE PRIMARY YEARS
